2. Committee Mechanics and Combat System

This committee will operate as a fast-paced Fictional Joint Crisis Committee (FJCC) focused on strategy, diplomacy, military operations, intelligence activities, and roleplay. Unlike traditional General Assembly committees, delegates are expected to actively shape the storyline through directives, crisis responses, negotiations, and strategic decision-making. The committee will continuously evolve according to delegate actions and crisis updates provided by the crisis staff.

Throughout the committee, both factions will attempt to gain political, military, technological, and strategic advantages over one another. Delegates may conduct covert missions, develop technology, recruit allies, gather intelligence, sabotage enemy operations, negotiate temporary alliances, or launch direct attacks against opposing forces. Every decision made by delegates may significantly influence the direction of the conflict and the balance of power within the committee.

Operations and combat will primarily be conducted through written directives rather than direct roleplay combat. Delegates are expected to submit realistic and detailed directives explaining the objective of the mission, the resources being used, the characters involved, and the intended outcome. The crisis staff will evaluate each directive according to realism, available resources, strategic planning, character abilities, and current committee conditions.

Characters possess different strengths, weaknesses, and limitations which must be respected throughout the committee. Extremely unrealistic actions, instant victories, or actions that ignore established character abilities will not be accepted by the crisis staff. Delegates are encouraged to think creatively while remaining consistent with the Marvel Civil War universe and their assigned character's capabilities.

Combat outcomes will be determined entirely by the crisis staff. Factors such as tactical preparation, teamwork, technological advantages, environmental conditions, public support, and previous operations may influence the success or failure of military actions. Civilian casualties, public destruction, or politically controversial actions may also affect international opinion and create additional consequences during the progression of the crisis.

The committee will contain constant crisis updates, unexpected events, political developments, betrayals, technological failures, and emerging threats. Delegates must therefore remain adaptable and responsive throughout the entire committee process. Cooperation, strategy, and crisis management will play a far greater role than simple combat strength alone.

3. Introduction to Marvel Civil War

The world once viewed superheroes as symbols of hope, protection, and justice. From defending New York against alien invasions to preventing global catastrophes, the Avengers became one of the most influential forces on Earth. However, as the scale of destruction surrounding enhanced individuals continued to grow, public trust slowly began to collapse. Governments, civilians, and international organizations started questioning whether individuals with extraordinary abilities should truly operate without limitation or oversight.

Political tensions rapidly increased as nations demanded stronger control over superhuman activity. While some believed that enhanced individuals should be regulated under international authority to ensure global security, others argued that freedom and independent action were necessary to protect justice from political corruption and manipulation. These disagreements eventually divided the Avengers into two opposing factions.

Led by Tony Stark, Team Iron Man supports regulation, accountability, and cooperation with governments in order to maintain stability and public safety. On the other hand, Team Captain America believes that placing superheroes under political control threatens individual freedom and could allow governments to misuse enhanced individuals for their own agendas.

As negotiations failed and distrust intensified, the conflict escalated beyond political debate and transformed into a global superhuman civil war. Heroes, governments, intelligence agencies, and civilians are now forced to choose sides in a rapidly destabilizing world where every action may determine the future of humanity itself.



4. Historical Background & Beginning of the Conflict

Before the outbreak of the Civil War, enhanced individuals had already become a major part of global politics and international security. The formation of the Avengers marked a new era in which superheroes were no longer isolated figures, but organized forces capable of influencing the fate of entire nations. While the Avengers successfully defended Earth from threats such as the Chitauri invasion in New York and the rise of Ultron, these victories often came with massive destruction, economic damage, and civilian casualties.

As the years passed, governments and international organizations grew increasingly concerned about the unchecked power of enhanced individuals. Many world leaders argued that superheroes operated without accountability and posed a threat to global stability. Public opinion became divided: some continued to support the Avengers as protectors of humanity, while others viewed them as dangerous weapons beyond political control.

5. Current Situation and Committee Structure

Within this chaotic environment, two major factions dominate the conflict.

Team Iron Man:

Led by Tony Stark, Team Iron Man supports the international regulation and supervision of enhanced individuals. This faction believes that unchecked power creates instability and that global security can only be maintained through accountability, structure, and cooperation with governments. Team Iron Man possesses advanced technology, strong financial resources, and access to official intelligence networks.

Members: Iron Man, Spider-Man, Vision, Black Widow, War Machine, Black Panther

Team Captain America:

Led by Steve Rogers, Team Captain America opposes government control over enhanced individuals. This faction believes that political systems are vulnerable to corruption and that superheroes must remain independent in order to protect justice and freedom. Team Captain America relies heavily on mobility, covert operations, tactical flexibility, and underground support networks.

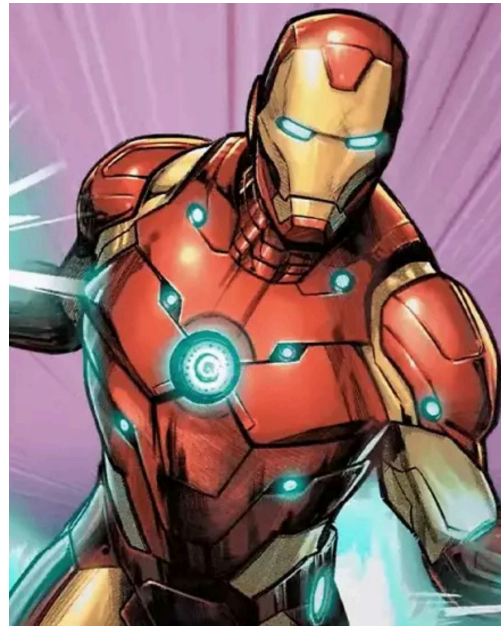
Members: Captain America, Falcon, Winter Soldier, Scarlet Witch, Hawkeye, Ant-Man

6. Character Profiles

Iron Man (Tony Stark)

Tony Stark, known publicly as Iron Man, is a billionaire inventor, engineer, and former CEO of Stark Industries. Throughout the years, he became one of the world's most influential superheroes after developing advanced armored suits capable of extreme combat and defense. Following countless destructive battles involving enhanced individuals, Stark gradually began supporting stronger regulation and government oversight, believing that unlimited power without accountability could eventually threaten global stability.



Iron Man's greatest strength is his technological superiority. His suits provide flight, advanced weapon systems, artificial intelligence support, surveillance capabilities, and massive destructive power. In addition to his combat abilities, Stark possesses enormous financial resources and political influence, allowing him to rapidly develop new technologies and coordinate large-scale operations. However, his dependence on technology creates vulnerabilities against hacking, EMP attacks, or system failures. His emotional guilt regarding previous disasters also occasionally affects his judgment during high-pressure situations.

Captain America (Steve Rogers)

Steve Rogers, also known as Captain America, is a World War II super soldier created through an experimental enhancement program. After decades of serving as a symbol of justice and heroism, Rogers became one of the most respected figures among both civilians and enhanced individuals. During the growing political conflict surrounding superhero regulation, he strongly opposed government control and argued that freedom and moral judgment should never be controlled by political systems.



Captain America possesses enhanced strength, speed, endurance, and combat abilities far beyond

normal human limits. His vibranium shield provides extraordinary offensive and defensive capabilities during battle. Rogers is also an exceptional strategist and battlefield leader who inspires loyalty among his allies. However, his deep distrust of governments often prevents compromise, creating tension even within his own team. Compared to technologically advanced opponents, he also lacks access to large-scale resources and heavy weapon systems.

Spider-Man (Peter Parker)

Peter Parker, known as Spider-Man, is a young enhanced individual who gained his abilities after being bitten by a genetically altered spider. Despite his age and limited experience, Parker quickly became one of the most talented heroes involved in the conflict due to his intelligence, agility, and creativity in combat situations. Recruited by Tony Stark, Spider-Man joins Team Iron Man believing that regulation can help prevent unnecessary destruction.



Spider-Man possesses superhuman reflexes, agility, strength, wall-crawling abilities, and an advanced danger-detection instinct commonly referred to as “spider-sense.” His web-shooters allow him to move rapidly through urban environments while restraining enemies without lethal force. Peter’s scientific intelligence also makes him highly adaptable during operations. However, his lack of battlefield experience and emotional nature can place him at a disadvantage against more experienced opponents. His strong concern for civilian safety may also interfere with difficult tactical decisions.

Black Widow (Natasha Romanoff)

Natasha Romanoff, known as Black Widow, is a former assassin and intelligence operative trained through highly classified espionage programs. Over the years, she became one of the most effective covert agents in the world due to her expertise in infiltration, interrogation, stealth combat, and psychological manipulation. Although she initially operates alongside Team Iron Man, her independent mindset often makes her true loyalties difficult to predict.



Black Widow's greatest advantage lies in her intelligence and strategic thinking rather than raw physical strength. She is highly skilled in hand-to-hand combat, espionage, and covert missions requiring stealth and deception. Her adaptability allows her to survive in both political and battlefield environments. However, because she lacks superhuman abilities, she is more vulnerable during large-scale direct combat against enhanced opponents. Her tendency to keep secrets and operate independently may also create trust issues within her team.

Vision

Vision is an advanced synthetic being created through a combination of artificial intelligence, vibranium technology, and the Mind Stone. Possessing extraordinary intelligence and immense physical power, Vision is considered one of the most dangerous enhanced individuals in the world. He supports Team Iron Man because he believes that regulation and control are necessary to prevent humanity from destroying itself through uncontrolled power.



Vision possesses abilities such as flight, density manipulation, energy projection, and near-indestructible durability. His advanced computational intelligence allows him to process enormous amounts of information and assist in strategic analysis. Vision can phase through solid matter or drastically increase his physical density during combat. However, his internal conflict between logic and emotion occasionally affects his decisions. His technological nature also creates vulnerabilities to hacking, corruption, or energy disruption during cyber warfare scenarios.

War Machine (James Rhodes)

James Rhodes, known as War Machine, is a military officer and longtime ally of Tony Stark. Equipped with a heavily weaponized armored suit designed specifically for warfare, Rhodes strongly believes that enhanced individuals should cooperate with governments in order to maintain international



security and stability during the growing superhuman conflict.

War Machine specializes in heavy combat, aerial operations, and military coordination. His armor contains advanced weapons systems including missiles, machine guns, and tactical combat support technology capable of causing large-scale destruction on the battlefield. Rhodes' military discipline and operational experience make him one of Team Iron Man's most reliable soldiers. However, his heavy dependence on armored technology creates vulnerabilities if his systems become damaged or disabled. Compared to more agile heroes, his combat style is also less effective during stealth or infiltration operations.

Black Panther (T'Challa)

T'Challa, king of Wakanda and protector of the Black Panther mantle, is one of the most influential political leaders involved in the conflict. After witnessing growing instability caused by enhanced individuals, T'Challa becomes increasingly supportive of regulation and international security efforts. Although he cooperates with Team Iron Man, his primary responsibility remains the protection of Wakanda and its people.

Black Panther possesses enhanced strength, agility, reflexes, and endurance through the mystical heart-shaped herb of Wakanda. His vibranium suit absorbs kinetic energy and provides exceptional protection during combat. In addition to his physical abilities, T'Challa commands Wakanda's highly advanced technology and diplomatic influence. However, his duties as king often force him to prioritize national interests over personal relationships or team loyalty. Emotional decisions connected to personal loss may also affect his judgment during moments of crisis.



Falcon (Sam Wilson)

Sam Wilson, also known as Falcon, is a former military pararescue specialist and one of Captain America's closest allies. Believing that governments should not have complete authority over enhanced individuals, Wilson joins Team



Captain America in defense of freedom and independent action.

Falcon uses advanced aerial combat equipment that allows him to fly at high speeds while providing reconnaissance and tactical support during operations. His military background gives him strong leadership skills and combat discipline, particularly during rescue or coordination missions. Falcon also utilizes drone systems to gather intelligence and monitor enemy movement. However, unlike many enhanced individuals, Wilson does not possess superhuman physical abilities, making him more vulnerable during direct combat. Damage to his flight equipment can also significantly reduce his effectiveness.

Winter Soldier (Bucky Barnes)

Bucky Barnes, known as the Winter Soldier, is a former assassin manipulated and controlled by HYDRA for many years. Once Captain America's closest friend, Barnes became an international threat due to his violent past and involvement in numerous covert assassinations. During the Civil War, he sides with Team Captain America as governments attempt to capture and control him.



The Winter Soldier possesses enhanced strength, reflexes, durability, and advanced combat training. His cybernetic arm grants him immense physical power capable of overwhelming most opponents in close combat. Barnes is highly skilled in stealth, infiltration, and tactical assassinations, making him extremely dangerous during covert operations. However, his traumatic memories and psychological conditioning continue to affect his mental stability. His controversial history also creates political tension and distrust among governments and civilians worldwide.

Scarlet Witch (Wanda Maximoff)

Wanda Maximoff, known as Scarlet Witch, is one of the most powerful enhanced individuals in existence. After years of trauma, experimentation, and political persecution, Wanda became increasingly distrustful of governments and institutions, eventually supporting Team Captain America's belief in independence and freedom.



Scarlet Witch possesses extraordinary telekinetic and energy manipulation abilities capable of affecting both individuals and entire environments. She can move objects, create devastating energy attacks, manipulate matter, and disrupt enemy operations with overwhelming force. Her immense power makes her one of the most feared combatants in the conflict. However, Wanda's abilities are closely tied to her emotional state, meaning stress, anger, or fear can destabilize her control. Public fear regarding her destructive capabilities also places immense pressure on her actions and decisions.

Hawkeye (Clint Barton)

Clint Barton, also known as Hawkeye, is a master marksman and former SHIELD operative who joins Team Captain America despite attempting to retire from active conflict. Although he lacks superhuman abilities, Barton remains one of the most skilled tactical operatives involved in the war due to his precision, experience, and strategic mindset.

Hawkeye specializes in ranged combat, covert operations, and battlefield coordination. His advanced archery skills allow him to neutralize enemies with exceptional accuracy using a variety of specialized arrows and tactical equipment. Barton's SHIELD training also makes him highly effective during infiltration and intelligence missions. However, his lack of enhanced physical abilities places him at a disadvantage during large-scale combat against stronger opponents. His loyalty to his teammates may also interfere with objective decision-making during emotional situations.



Ant-Man (Scott Lang)

Scott Lang, known as Ant-Man, is a former engineer and thief who becomes an important member of Team Captain America. Although less experienced than many other heroes, Lang strongly supports the belief that enhanced individuals should remain independent rather than controlled by governments or international organizations.



Using advanced Pym Particle technology, Ant-Man can shrink to microscopic size or grow into a giant form during combat. His abilities allow him to infiltrate secure locations, sabotage enemy systems, and conduct stealth operations impossible for most heroes. Scott's creativity and unpredictability often make him highly effective during unconventional missions. However, his limited battlefield experience and occasional lack of discipline may create operational risks. The unstable nature of Pym Particle technology can also lead to dangerous technical failures during critical moments.

7. Rules, Directives, and Delegate Expectations

Delegates participating in this committee are expected to actively contribute to both the storyline and the progression of the crisis through strategic thinking, diplomacy, creativity, and roleplay. As this committee functions as a Fictional Joint Crisis Committee (FJCC), delegates should understand that the flow of debate will be significantly faster and more dynamic than a traditional General Assembly committee. Active participation and continuous interaction with both the crisis staff and other delegates are strongly encouraged throughout the committee.

All delegates are required to remain realistic and consistent with the abilities, limitations, and personalities of their assigned characters. Actions that are excessively unrealistic, overpowered, or impossible within the established Marvel Civil War universe will not be accepted. Delegates may not instantly eliminate other characters, fully control another delegate's actions, or create abilities and resources beyond their character's realistic capabilities. The crisis staff reserves the authority to reject or modify any directive that violates committee realism or balance.

Directives will serve as the primary method of conducting operations within the committee. Delegates may submit directives individually or together with allies depending on the nature of the operation. Directives should clearly explain the objective of the mission, the resources being used, the characters involved, and the intended plan of action. Well-structured, creative, and strategically realistic directives are more likely to succeed during crisis evaluation.

Examples of acceptable directives may include intelligence gathering missions, infiltration operations, technological development projects, political negotiations, rescue missions, sabotage attempts, surveillance programs, recruitment campaigns, or military operations. Delegates are encouraged to think creatively and use their character's unique strengths in order to influence the conflict.

Respectful conduct toward chairs, crisis staff, and fellow delegates is expected at all times. Excessive metagaming, disruptive behavior, or intentional interference with committee flow may result in warnings or penalties at the discretion of the chairboard. Since the outcome of the Civil War will be shaped directly by delegate decisions, teamwork, adaptability, and

strategic planning will play a major role in determining which faction ultimately achieves victory.

8. Research Questions

- Should enhanced individuals operate under international regulation and government oversight?
- Can absolute freedom for superheroes create greater risks for global security and civilian safety?
- To what extent should governments be trusted with the control of enhanced individuals and advanced technologies?
- Is public safety more important than personal freedom during times of crisis and instability?
- How can enhanced individuals be held accountable for destruction and civilian casualties caused during operations?
- What are the political and social consequences of a global conflict between superheroes?
- Should powerful individuals have the right to act independently outside international law?
- How may technological superiority influence the balance of power during the Civil War?
- Can cooperation between opposing factions still be possible despite ideological differences?
- What role should intelligence agencies, governments, and civilians play during a superhuman conflict?
- How might public opinion and media influence the outcome of the Civil War?
- Is it possible to maintain justice and morality during large-scale political and military conflicts?
